EMERGENCY SERVICES AND PUBLIC PROTECTION

Bridgeton Rotary (Lunch) Club's August 20th weekly program topic at Gia's Suburban House featured "Highlights of Cumberland County's Emergency Services and Public Protection" presented by James R. Matlock, Sr., Director, Cumberland County Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection.

Mr. Matlock noted first of all the name change now in place for his department of what used to be the Department of Public Safety. He expressed the present name more accurately represents the encompassing work of his department, with its four divisions: Office of Consumer Affairs; Office of Emergency Management; 9-1-1 Fire / Rescue Training Academy; 9-1-1 Emergency Communications Center.

- First, The Office of Consumer Affairs consists of "Weights and Measures", which actively checks calibration of all commercial gasoline and diesel fuel pumps being used at the approximately sixty (60) active gas stations throughout Cumberland County.
- In addition, the Weights and Measures staff also insures the accuracy of all scales used in the approximately 595 commercial businesses throughout the county.

- The Office of Consumer Affairs also supports the work of "Consumer Protection".
- Consumer complaints received concerning business dealings and transactions are sought to be mediated by the state certified Cumberland County Consumer Protection Investigator, Jane McCormick.

- Secondly, is Office of Emergency Management (OEM), which is coordinated by Joe Sever, together with a large staff of full and part time county employees, assisted by a large number of invaluable are made and instituted.

- Thirdly is the 9-1-1 Emergency Communications Center, which is supervised by Don Philippi, the 9-1-1 Division Head/Chief and his staff of 28, full or part time, Public Safety Telecommunicators.
- Emergency 9-1-1 calls, either cell or land lines, that come into the center bring about the dispatching of fire departments personnel and equipment, medical emergency technicians, police and paramedics.

He then showed a professionally video taped piece of film that really enabled audience members to gain an appreciation for the hard and dangerous work that fire fighters often face.

Reach One, Keep One

The new membership slogan emphasizes the need for Rotarians to focus on both recruitment and retention in their membership growth efforts.

Rotarians are responding enthusiastically to the new membership slogan, "Each Rotarian: Reach One, Keep One."

"The slogan is a gentle reminder to do it!" notes John T. Capps III, a member of the Rotary Club of Morehead City-Noon, North Carolina, USA. "Keep a 3 x 5 card handy at all times to record that moment in time when the name of a potential member flashes in your thoughts."

"Each one of us became a Rotarian because someone invited us to attend a Rotary meeting," agrees William Pollard, past governor of District 7600 (Virginia, USA). "We all have a responsibility to grow our Rotary family so that we can continue to provide service to our local and international communities."

The RI Board of Directors adopted the new membership slogan at its June

meeting.

The slogan emphasizes the need for Rotarians to focus on both recruitment and retention in their membership growth efforts.

"Membership development is each Rotarian's responsibility," said Paul Netzel, a member of RI's Membership Development and Retention Committee and a past RI director.

"'Reach One' reminds us that because Rotary membership is by invitation, it's essential that each Rotarian reaches out and invites someone to join," added Netzel, a member of the Rotary Club of Los Angeles.

"'Keep One' reminds us that it's not sufficient to simply sponsor someone into Rotary; we must also see that new members become active and involved Rotarians. We know this is an essential element in membership retention."

The new slogan complements the Board's long-term membership strategy, which was also adopted at the June meeting.

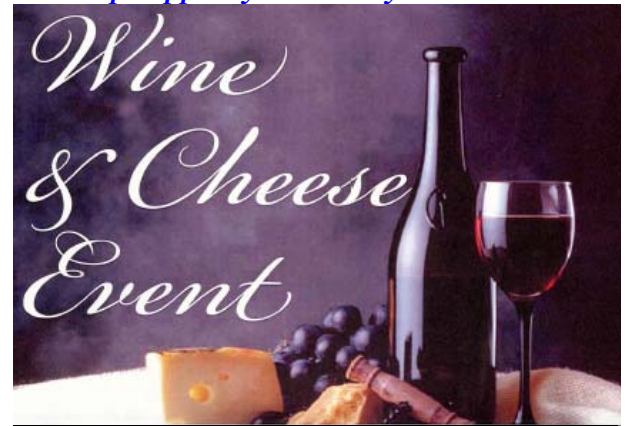
